What is NAWT up to?

The NAWT Board of Directors recently participated in a strategic planning process where they examined the organization's mission statement and goals. They then confirmed that these continued to reflect the organization's views for the future.

During this process, the Board reviewed internal factors which included the following items:

- Financial
 - NAWT saw a steady financial growth in 2017. We expect better outcome for the upcoming years.
- Membership Growth
 - Total membership has steadily increased during the last four years. We have seen growth in the independent, company and association memberships.
- Member Benefits
 - The Board of Directors is currently working on improving several membership categories with incentives to join, additional benefits and more ways to communicate with the association.
- Stakeholders
 - Several types of stakeholders were identified. NAWT is working extensively to move forward with the right plan to benefit our members.
- Training Programs
 - NAWT experienced a large increase of trainings in the beginning of 2018. We are currently updating our training programs to stay up to date with the changing industry.
- Use of Technology
 - Membership database will be updated, and additional online resources will be provided for members.
- Marketing
 - Website changes are coming to NAWT's member portal. Newsletters and brochures will allow members to have more knowledge and resources through NAWT.
